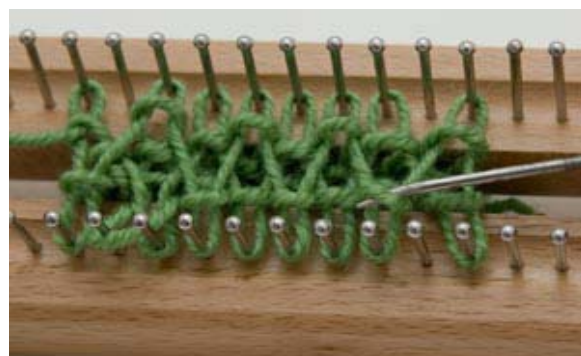


Inside Increase

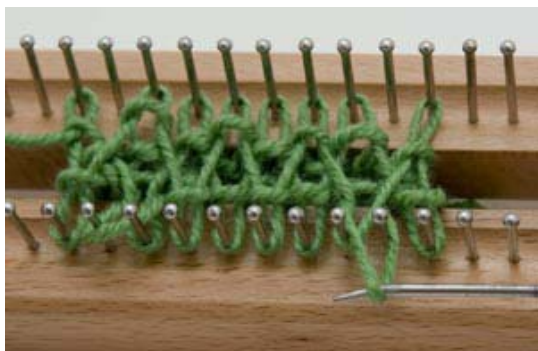
Increases can be done anywhere in the knitting as well as at the beginning of a row. Doing the increase inside the knitting makes the shape smoother and less noticeable. It is also used in multiples when you want to create a flare to the knitting as in a large brimmed hat, or a sweater front. By shifting the loops over to expose empty needles, the increase is done from the next stitch and the open needles are filled in. You then, knit on the full amount of stitches for a wider piece.



1. Shift outer loops over to create open needles.



2. Increase from 3rd stitch to empty needle by lifting previous stitch and placing on empty needle.



3. Cover all empty needles with increase. Weave next row over all needles.
