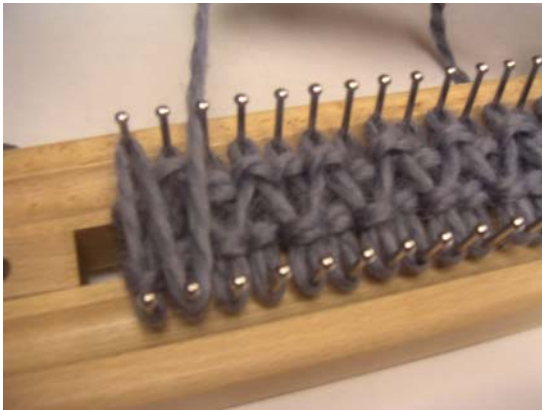


Stockinette Stitch



This is basic stitch for working on the knitting board. It can be used for most anything. It is smooth and looks like a basic knit stitch created with 2 needles except that it is the same on both sides.



Weave yarn up around the first needle on top board. Bring down to lower 2nd needle.

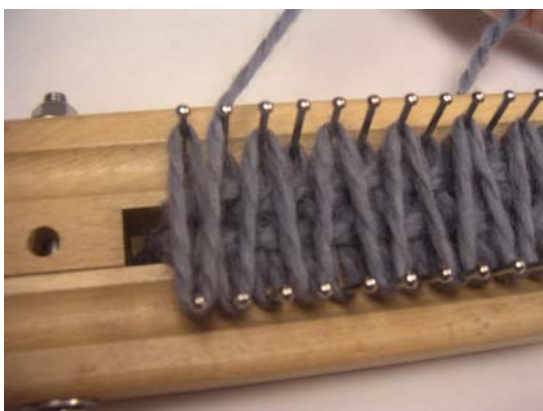


Continue wrapping the yarn from front row (needles closest to you) to back row, weaving around every other needle.



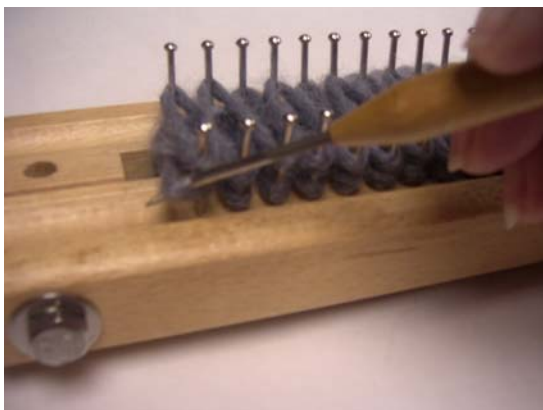
Weave to end of needles used.
Wrap around both end needles,
straight across.

Turn board around.

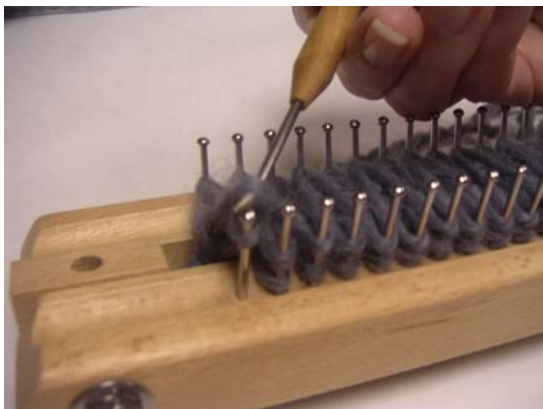


Continue weaving the yarn around
every other needle so that all
needles have the current wrap for
this row.

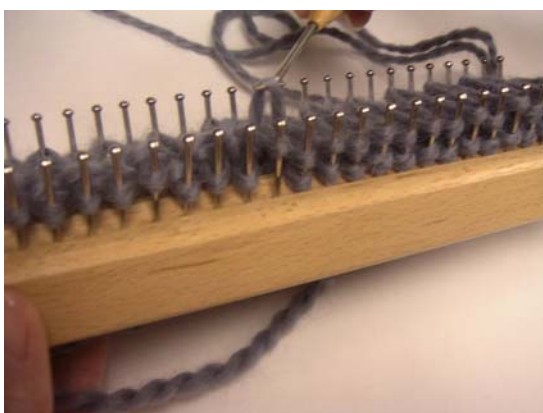
When you get back to beginning of
row, the last needle wrapped will
be the one directly across from the
first needle.



With knit hook, lift the lower loop
on that needle up and over the top
of needle so that the yarn is
locked and will not unravel.



Hook over all needles by lifting the lower loop over top of needles, starting at opposite end of board from where yarn is attached.



Be sure all needles get hooked over. If any part of the strand of yarn from the lower loop is not hooked over, it may make it difficult for the row to move down on board.



Once all needles are hooked over, pull down on the anchor yarn or knitting to secure the stitches and move the row down thru the board.

Continue with the weaving for another row of Stockinette or change to next stitch desired.
